Kaya. Welcome back to Term four. This term is going to be very busy so please keep an eye on your child's bags for notes. We will put important dates in the newsletter as well.


There will be a **P** and **C** meeting on Tuesday 29th October at 9:00am in the CA Room. All are welcome. We look forward to seeing you there.

Hello and Kaya!


